Background and Rationale

Sub-Saharan Africa encounters significant obstacles in reforming its agriculture to guarantee food security, adapt to climate change, and foster economic growth. Seeds, as the essential input in farming, are crucial, and the seed sector significantly influences the productivity and sustainability of agricultural systems.

While significant progress has been made in both public and private sector-led crop improvement initiatives, collaboration between these two spheres remains limited in scope and scale. The CGIAR, through its Collaborative Breeding Leadership Program (CBLP), and AFSTA, as a key industry voice representing private seed companies across Africa, are working together to bridge this gap.

This webinar will serve as a platform for meaningful engagement and dialogue between national and international public breeding institutions and the private seed sector, with the aim of strengthening mutual understanding, identifying shared priorities, and building joint-action areas. It will also highlight the importance of coordinated approaches for investments, technology scaling, and knowledge-sharing in plant breeding to better serve the needs of African farmers.

Objectives

- 1. Highlighting AFSTA's strategic direction and vision for private sector growth in Africa's seed industry.
- 2. Showcase the CGIAR CBLP perspectives and its goals for enhancing collaboration with seed companies and explore shared opportunities for leadership development focused on crop improvement and seed systems
- 3. Share insights from private seed companies regarding their R&D contributions and identify gaps in crop development coverage.
- 4. Present and support successful Public and Private partnership models of collaborative breeding and technology transfer to the private sector through existing consortia (Africa Vegetable Breeding Consortium -AVBC, and African Cereals & Legumes Breeding Consortium ACLBC).
- 5. Accelerate discussions on opportunities, constraints, and pathways to enhance public-private breeding partnerships, including policy dialogue in advancing the plant breeding innovation agenda in Africa.

Expected Outcomes

- Improved understanding of AFSTA's strategic plan 3.0 by CGIAR-NARES/SME breeding and seed systems teams, leading to clearer areas of public-private collaboration.
- The unveiling of CGIAR's CBLP as a key frontier in leadership development for early and mid-career scientists, focusing on efficient crop improvement and delivery into seed systems, and clarifying CBLP's collaboration opportunities.
- Investment gaps for priority crops identified, and action items towards concerted breeding efforts and delivery to seed systems explored
- Consolidating programs and existing consortia to ensure concerted and inclusive efforts for sustainability and impact at scale, or forming a new crop-based consortium if necessary.
- A more focused strategy on joint resource mobilization for talent development aimed at developing tomorrow's leaders today, from development partners on plant breeding and seed systems projects on the continent.
