



1. Background and Rationale

The African Cereal and Legume Breeding Consortium (ACLBC), a collaborative initiative driven by the Technologies for African Agricultural Transformation (TAAT) and the African Seed Trade Association (AFSTA), was established to accelerate the adoption and scaling of improved seed technologies in Africa. The ACLBC targets the engagement of over 200 seed companies to commercialize TAAT-vetted varieties and hybrids of cereals and legumes.

In preparation for the maiden ACLBC annual workshop, a 2-acre demonstration plot has been established in collaboration with the Kenya Agricultural and Livestock Research Organization (KALRO). The demonstration showcases newly released, high-potential varieties of maize, soybean, rice, wheat, high-iron beans (HIB), sorghum, and millet. These are intended to stimulate interest among seed companies and catalyze the adoption, branding, and scaling of these elite varieties and hybrids from CGIAR Centres and Advanced Agricultural Research Institutions.

This workshop is organized by TAAT and AFSTA in collaboration with KALRO. The TAAT Clearinghouse provides overall coordination, with compacts supporting seed sourcing and breeders' participation. AFSTA is responsible for interactions and onboarding the seed companies. KALRO monitors and evaluates the demonstration plot, which will inform future scale-up efforts under ACLBC.

The ACLBC Annual Workshop will serve as a critical milestone for convening stakeholders to evaluate these varieties in the field, interact with TAAT Compacts and breeders (technology owners), and make informed decisions on future collaborations, licensing, and seed production.

2. Workshop Objectives

- Showcase the potential of TAAT-vetted varieties under real field conditions.
- Facilitate seed company engagement with breeders & TAAT compacts
- Conduct participatory selection of preferred varieties based on:
 Yield potential, Disease resistance and Market demand

- Strengthen partnerships for licensing & commercialization.
- Develop a roadmap for scaling ACLBC activities.
- To foster dialogue on technology commercialization, policy support, and access to foundation seed.
- To facilitate networking and partnership building among technology providers, breeders, seed companies and stakeholders in legumes and cereals.
- To build the capacity of breeders and researchers through hands-on sessions on modern breeding techniques and tools
- To support ACLBC's mission of accelerating seed technology adoption across Africa.

3. Key Features of the Workshop

Field Visit to the Demonstration Plot:

Participants will tour the 2-acre demonstration plot, subdivided into standardized 100 m² sections featuring a diverse range of newly released crop varieties.

Participatory Variety Evaluation:

Seed stakeholders will assess the performance of varieties in terms of growth habit, disease resistance, grain quality, and yield potential. Structured evaluation forms and guidance will be provided to capture feedback.

Engagement with Technology Owners:

Breeders and representatives from TAAT Compacts (Maize, Rice, Soybean, Sorghum/Millet, HIB, and Wheat) will be present to discuss variety characteristics, origin, performance data, and commercialization opportunities.

• Knowledge Exchange Sessions:

In-depth discussions on seed licensing, foundation seed availability, regulatory pathways, and market opportunities.

4. Expected Outcomes

- 5+ seed companies express intent to license showcased varieties.
- Documented list of preferred varieties for follow-up.
- Draft roadmap for ACLBC scale-up (led by TAAT/AFSTA).
- Strengthened partnerships between seed companies, breeders, and TAAT Compacts.
- Increased interest in licensing and scaling newly released varieties.
- Documentation of stakeholder-preferred varieties for follow-up support and seed system integration.
- Enhanced understanding of the seed commercialization process under the ACLBC framework.

5. Target Participants

The workshop is expected to attract about 50 participants majority of whom will be seed companies

- Seed companies and aggregators (ACLBC members and prospects)
- TAAT Compact representatives and breeders
- Officials from KALRO and the National Agricultural Research Systems (NARS)
- Development partners and donors
- AFSTA and TAAT Clearinghouse representatives



1. Introduction and Background

The African Seed Trade Association (AFSTA) and the Technologies for African Agricultural Transformation (TAAT) are pleased to invite you to the Maiden Annual Workshop of the African Cereal and Legume Breeding Consortium (ACLBC).

This workshop, held in collaboration with the Kenya Agricultural and Livestock Research Organization (KALRO), is a key event for accelerating the adoption and commercialization of improved seed technologies in Africa. It will provide a unique platform for seed companies, breeders, and other stakeholders to evaluate high-potential, newly released varieties of key cereals and legumes in the field and forge partnerships for their dissemination.

2. Workshop Objectives

The primary goals of the workshop are to:

- Showcase the on-field potential of new, TAAT-vetted crop varieties.
- Facilitate direct engagement and partnership-building between seed companies, breeders, and technology owners.
- Conduct a participatory selection of preferred varieties based on yield, resilience, and market demand.
- Foster dialogue on technology commercialization, policy support, and access to foundation seed.
- **Develop a clear roadmap** for scaling up ACLBC activities across the continent.

3. Program Highlights

The two-day program will be interactive and results-oriented, featuring:

- Field Visit to a Demonstration Plot to be held on 19th August 2025 (Njoro): An extensive tour of the 2-acre plot showcasing elite varieties of maize, soybean, rice, wheat, high-iron beans, sorghum, and millet.
- Participatory Variety Evaluation Workshop on 20th August 2025: A structured session for stakeholders to assess and provide feedback on the performance of different varieties.

- Technical & Business Sessions (Nairobi): In-depth presentations and panel discussions on variety performance, seed licensing, regulatory pathways, and market opportunities.
- **Networking Opportunities:** A welcome cocktail and dedicated sessions to foster interaction and collaboration among participants.

4. Target Participants

The workshop aims to bring together approximately 50 key stakeholders from the African seed sector, including:

- Seed companies and aggregators (ACLBC members and prospective members).
- Breeders and representatives from TAAT Compacts.
- Officials from National Agricultural Research Systems (NARS).
- Development partners and other strategic stakeholders.
